TEXAS ARCHITECTS AWARD OVER 70 BUILDINGS AND URBAN PLANNING PROJECTS FROM 28 NATIONS TO DEFINE THE STANDARD FOR THE BEST NEW GLOBAL DESIGN FOR 2017

Announcing the World's Prestigious 2017 International Architecture Awards to be Exhibited at Contemporary Space Athens September 8-October 1 with an Awards Gala Dinner in front of the Acropolis in Athens, Greece September 8

DALLAS, TEXAS (August 18, 2017) —The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture and Design, together with The European Centre for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies have announced the winners of the 2017 *International Architecture Awards*, the most rigorous and prestigious awards program for new buildings designed across the globe.

The award-winning buildings set the standard for the best in today's architecture.

Hundreds of submissions were received for this year's annual Global Awards Program from architecture firms from across Europe, Asia, the Middle East, Australia, and the Americas—each hoping to warrant an *International Architecture Award*.

A final shortlist of over 300 projects was presented to a Jury of Texas architects and educators.

The International Architecture Awards are the largest and most extensive global architecture awards program in the world, honoring new skyscrapers, commercial buildings, urban plans, private residences, and real estate projects that achieve a high standard of excellence in design, construction, planning, and sustainability and promote the best practice in all types of real estate development for the private and public sectors, including new skyscrapers, high rises, corporate and institutional buildings, commercial projects, sports stadiums, bridges, airports, city planning, restorations and adaptive reuse, community projects, religious and civic buildings, urban planning, and interiors.

This year's selected buildings are from 35 nations including: Angola, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Canada, Chile, China, Denmark, El Salvador, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Israel, Italy, Japan, Kenya, México, Morocco, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Palestine, Peru, Poland, Qatar, Republic of Singapore, Spain, South Korea, Sweden, Vietnam, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, and The United States.

"The selected new buildings and urban planning projects in this year's edition of *The International Architecture Awards* illustrate an amazing collection of buildings and urban environments that have the capacity to amaze, inspire and improve our quality of life. The 2017 Awards demonstrate a dedication to the highest standards in building design that continues to impact contemporary design today. These new buildings demonstrate the fantastic standard of architectural talent working across the globe, as well as the ambition and determination of the visionary clients who commission them," states Christian Narkiewicz-Laine, Museum President, The Chicago Athenaeum.

"The Awards put a spotlight on some of the smaller and unique, but no less ambitious, projects. They show that budget, location or many other challenges are no constraints to the production of superb quality architecture as long as you have the commitment of an imaginative and capable architect working with a great client."

"These 75 buildings are what the best architecture looks like today," he continues.

"The awards are given to buildings across the world recognized as making a significant contribution to the state of today's architecture. The jury praised this collection, saying 'the buildings exude a sense of calmness and freshness and are a tour-de-force in the exploration and use of sustainable materials, but also remarkable places to work and to enjoy'."

"It is so clear that good architecture impacts on people's lives, and these Global Awards are a vitally important part of the continuous process of raising standards," Narkiewicz-Laine expresses.
